

Writing a book about natural constants sounds about as interesting as actually reading one. Such was not the case for me, however, as the study of natural constants took me into fascinating areas I had never expected. The journey from natural constants to determining the time and place of future events was for me a fascinating one. No less a student of science and prophecy than Isaac Newton devoted much of his life to the study and interpretation of prophecy along these lines.

Newton, who was a Christian in the modern sense of the word, believed, as far as this study is concerned, three things:

- 1) God created the universe and sent his (messenger) Son to first appear as the suffering savior, with this to be followed by His return as the conquering or ruling savior.
- 2) The ancient Jewish writers spoke of both manifestations of this Messiah.
- 3) And the dimensions of the universe and the measurements of the temples, particularly Solomon's Temple and the temple to be built at the time of the second manifestation of the Messiah (savior), contained information on the time and place of significant events in history.

The mile, the foot, the inch, the meter and the second are all based on constants that occur, or have occurred, in nature.

The number 5040 is unique, it being the product of 7 times 6 times 5 times 4 and so on all the way to 1.

Half of 5040 is 2520 which is the product of 360, the number of days in the year (in earlier times), times 7.

The number 2520 times π , the circumference to diameter ratio of a circle, gives the diameter of the earth.

One half of 2520, or 1260 is the diameter of Avebury Circle in feet, an extremely old structure in England. And the circumference of Avebury Circle is close to one statute mile.

The crop circles that have appear every spring in the south of England since the spring of 1980 seem to be centered about Avebury Circle. If you draw lines from Avebury Circle to the center of the earth and from Jerusalem to the center of the earth, the angle formed is 33 degrees. Adding 33 years to 1980 produces the year 2013.

Newton calculated the beginning of the end times, or as he put it, the earliest time when the Messiah would make his second appearance, at the year 2060.

Given the advantage of a longer historical perspective, Newton may have been mistaken as to when to start counting years, and if so, the minimum time for the second appearance of the Messiah might be the year 2013.
